About the theme of the workshop:

Day-1 (Date: 08-11-2019):

The Seven Day National Level Workshop on Teaching-Learning and Evaluation in Choice-Based Credit System was started on 8th November, 2019 at Jhanji H N S College. The inaugural session of the workshop was started with the singing of the Ramdhun by the teachers of the college which was followed by the lighting of the ceremonial lamp by Sri Rajani Kanta Goswami, REtd. Principal i/c of Jhanji H N S College. Dr Manjit Gogoi, the principal of the college and the chairperson of the workshop welcomed all the esteemed guests and participants to the workshop as well as the college. Dr Gopal Ch Hazarika, the former Director of the College Development Council, and the existing Co-ordinator of IGNOU Study centre and the chairperson of Computer Science and Applications of Dibrugarh University inaugurated the Workshop. Dr Kalyan Bhuyan, the Director of IQAC, Professor of Physics, Dibrugarh University graced the occasion as the guest of honour of the inaugural ceremony.

On the occasion of the 150th Birth Anniversary of Mahamanab Mahatma Gandhi the UGC approved Gandhian Study Centre of the college felicitated two eminent freedom fighters of Sivasagar District Viz. Srijt. Golap Gogoi and Chao Purnakanta Duwarah respectively.

The inaugural session was anchored by Mrs Sima Nath, the Co-ordinator of the workshop and it ended with vote of thanks given by Dr Akashjyoti Saikia.

The 1st technical session of the workshop had begun at 1 pm. In this session Dr Bimal Borah, Principal of J.B. College, Jorhat served as the Resource person in which he elaborately dealt with the topic Grading System in CBCS. The grading system in CBCS is considered to be better than the conventional marks system and hence it has been followed in the top institutions in India and abroad.

Day-2 (Date: 10-11-2019):

Dr Hemanta Kumar Phukan, Retd. Principal of Sibsagar Girls College was the resource person of the 1st Technical Session of the end day of the workshop. His deliberation was related to the principles of Gandhiji under the theme Relevance of Gandhi's Philosophy in present Day Context. Mahatma Gandhi was indeed in institution rather than an individual. He experimented


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every aspect of life with utmost care. Self help was the moto of his life. "Swacha Bharat Abhiyan" is the outcome of Gandhiji's great teachings. He fought against untouchability to remove social injustice. Gandhiji opposed students' participation in politics. He also said that mother tongue should be used in offices and courts. Gandhi was a profound supporter of Brahmacharya and women education.

Dr Pranjal Buragohain, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Education, Dibrugarh University delivered his speech on Teaching on Andragogy as the resource person of the 2nd technical Session of the day 2nd day of the workshop. His deliberation basically covered the behavioural pattern of the adult learners, structure of the brain, functioning of the adolescent brain, the chemical set up of the brain etc. The impact of punishment and reward on adolescent behaviour was also significant aspect of his lecture.

Day-3(11-11-2019):

The day 3 of the Workshop was of two practical sessions of Laboratory work. Dr Manjit Gogoi, principal of Jhanji H N S college acted as the resource person in the session.

Day-4 (12-11-2019):

The resource person of the 1st technical session was Dr Deba Kumar Chakraborty, Professor, Dept. of Economics, Dibrugarh University. He dealt with one of the most important aspects of CBCS, i. e. "Internal Assessment in CBCS". His lecture covered all the aspects of internal assessment viz. Credit formula, Distribution of Credit, Grading system, Evaluation system and transfer of Credit.

In internal assessment different tools such as objective tests, written tests, paper presentation, laboratory work etc. may be employed. His lecture included the discussion regarding toughness level of the question papers. Two basic things should be in mind while setting a question paper---they are: 1. Knowledge (Recall and Recognition) and 2. Thinking (Analysis, Produce, Synthesise, Judge, Evaluate, Solve etc.)

The resource person of the 2nd technical session was Dr Binod Ch. Borah, Joint Registrar (Academic), Dibrugarh University. His topic was CBCS in Dibrugarh University with special reference to NEP, 2019. NEP, 2019 is a vision for the education system of India drawing from India's heritage. Liberal Education, High Quality Research is key features of this new education policy.

Day-5 (13-11-2019):

In the first technical session of the 5th day, Dr Basanta Gogoi, Principal, CTC Joysagar dealt with the topic Evaluation in CBCS.

Dr Anil Ch. Bora, Regional Director IGNOU, Jorhat Regional Centre was the Resource Person of the 2nd technical session of the day. He delivered lecture on "Constructive Approach in Teaching and Learning. Besides dealing with the topic, he conducted a practical session among


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the participants related to the various approaches followed by the teachers in teaching learning process.

Day-6 (14-11-2019):

The 1st technical session was conducted by Sarat Ch Kakaty, Professor, Dept. of Statistics, Dibrugarh University. He delivered his lecture on "Evaluation system in CBCS".

Dr Naraginti Amareshwaran Reddy, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Education, NEHU was the Resource person of the 2nd session in which he discussed the topic "Role of Online Courses in CBCS". He presented his session with a website www.futurelearn.com. In his powerpoint he showed a diagram on model of learning and teaching through online i.e. SEARCH stands for Specific, Excellent, Applicable, Reliable, Creative, Helpful.

Day-7 (15-11-2019):

Dr Jogen Ch. Kalita, Professor, Dept. of Zoology, Gauhati University was the resource person of this technical session in which he discussed the concept of CBCS. He talked about quality education and emphasised on heightening of standards in Indian Higher Education. He said that we should give the scholars/ students what they need for success in future. He advised to do scow analysis of Higher Education in India.

The seven Day Workshop came to an with the valedictory session which was presided over by Dr Manjit Gogoi, Chairperson of Workshop Committee. Dr Jogen Ch. Kalita was the guest of honour of the session and Sri Bhabani Kr Boruah was the chief guest of the programme.
